It's In the Details – The Wright and Niedecken Collaboration

Study the design drawing details and elements of the Allen House furnishings as designed and executed by Frank Lloyd Wright and George Niedecken, an interior architect and the founder of the department of decorative design at the Art Institute of Chicago. In 1907, Niedecken opened Niedecken-Walbridge with his brother-in-law where he constructed furniture for Wright's projects. The Allen House collaboration was the last of 12 projects between the two designers.

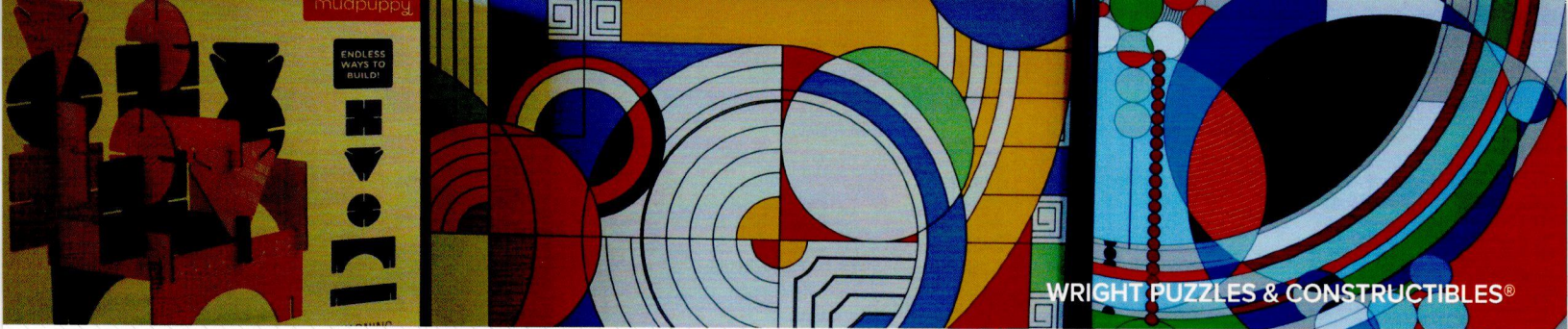

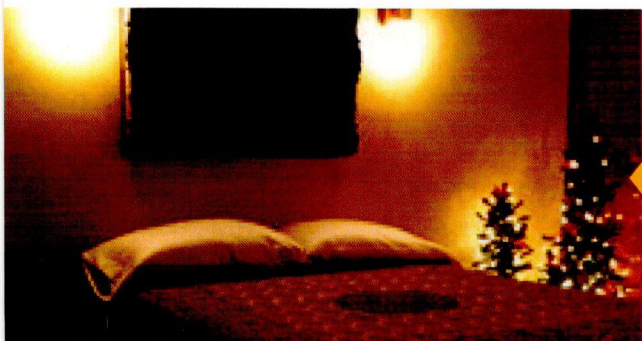
