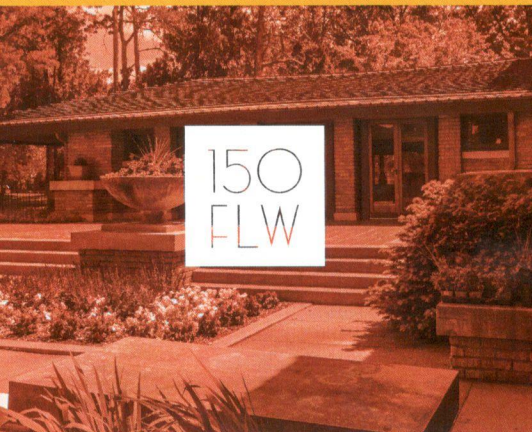

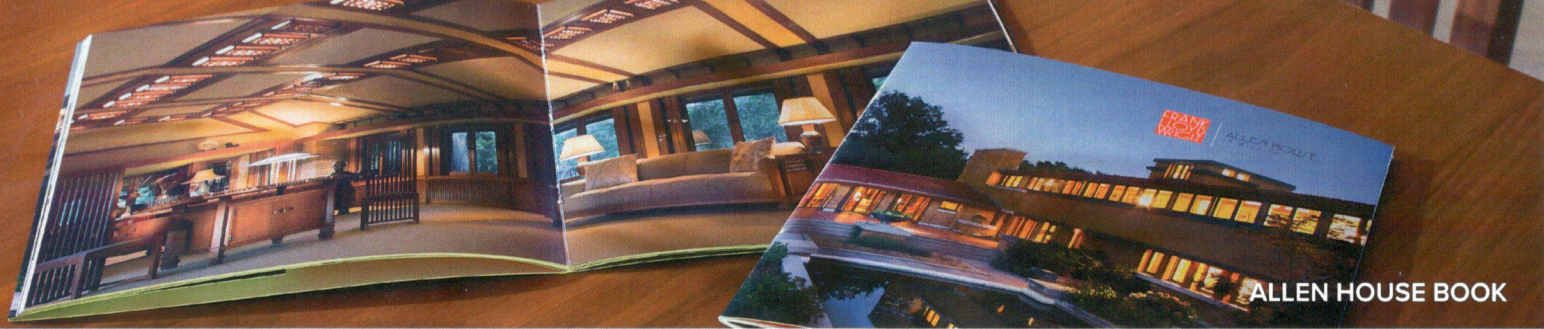

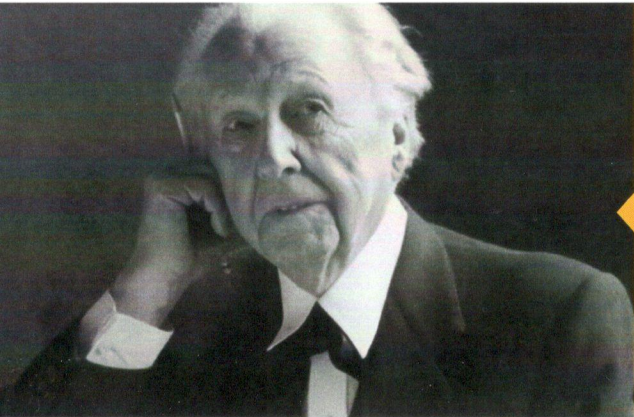




History Day 2017: Honoring an Architectural Master

Wright's given name was Frank Lincoln Wright, a tribute to President Abraham Lincoln. He changed his middle name to honor his mother's family name, Lloyd Jones.

In-progress:

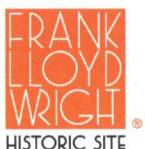
- Interior restoration of garden house
